# A SPECIAL MESSAGE FROM S.A.M. PRESIDENT-ELECT STEVEN A. SPENCE



I asked Jason Ladanye, a professional card magician, about his practice habits. At a minimum he practices 2 hours a day, sometimes more and sometimes he spreads that out throughout the day. Jason said; "... never expect any instant results. Practice and think you're one day closer to mastering whatever it is you're working on. Sometimes it's 20 days, sometimes its 2,000 days. A bottom deal took 1 year to get the mechanics down and another 4 years to perfect it." How much are you practicing your magic? I see a lot of people enter our annual contest and you can tell the ones who have practiced and the ones who have not.

I've seen many magicians pick up a trick at a lecture or a magic shop and perform it for the public the very next day. This is why magic and magicians have received a bad rap over the years.
